NEA-RA

The National Education Association's Representative Assembly was held this past July in Washington D.C. More than 8,000 delegates representing every state including teachers and support staff from military schools located in different parts of the world attended the RA. Gahanna membership elected six teachers who were elected: Sarah Hanson (LE), Paige Harding (MSE), Dwayne Marshall (LHS), Dave Palguta (MSE), Jenny Palguta (MSS) and Bobby Swartzentruber (LHS). The purpose of the RA is to inform the leadership of the NEA what course they are expected to follow. This is the largest democratic assembly in the United States. Some of the highlights of the meeting were visits by Hillary Clinton who is running for President and officially endorsed by NEA, Tennessee Senator Lamar Alexander (R) and Washington Senator Patty Murray (D) who both praised NEA for helping to push for "Every Student Succeeds Act" (ESSA) replacing the failed policies from "No Child Left Behind". Both senators asked teachers and the NEA to push for implementation of ESSA and to hold both state and local government officials accountable. The most moving speech came from Jahana Hayes, National Teacher of the Year, who reminded us "Teachers are not visitors in the lives of students. You are somebody's hero, and you don't even know it. Don't take that responsibility lightly. We often hear that teachers reserve their best lessons for when they are being observed. Remember that everyday your students are observing you."

Fund for Children and Public Education (FCPE)

What exactly does "FCPE" mean? FCPE is the acronym for OEA's Fund for Children and Public **Education** and **Diane Ballard** (MSE) is GJEA's FCPE chair.

Why should we support FCPE? FCPE allows us to have political involvement through the OEA that we would not have otherwise. Contributions to FCPE help us continue the fight for fairly funded educational opportunities for all children, help us to defend our own collective bargaining rights, and help us protect our retirement benefits. We get a reimbursement from this fund to promote local board of education candidates, which will be vital in Gahanna. Please give or increase your giving during this year's fund drive!

Remember it is illegal for your regular dues to be used to endorse or promote political issues or candidates, which is why it is so important to donate to this fund. eDues

During the 2012-2013 school year, a group of GJEA members chose to participate in an "eDues" pilot program through OEA. Instead of using payroll deduction, members paid their monthly association dues through either electronic withdrawal from a personal checking, savings account or credit card. One benefit

Legal Program

LECAL Did you know that one of the benefits you receive for being an OEA member is the OEA/NEA Attorney Referral Program? Association members (and their spouses) who work in Franklin County may access the program through Cloppert, Latanick, Sauter & Washburn LLP. This firm has done so much work for OEA that their office is in the OEA building in downtown Columbus.

Benefits include: up to four free 30-minute consultation sessions per year; free notary public service; free durable power of attorney for health care and a living will; reduced hourly rates for all types of personal legal work; and reduced contingent fees.

Delegate Elections Notice

During the last week of September, GJEA will hold elections for delegates to the 2016-2017 OEA and NEA Representative Assemblies. OEA delegates will represent our local membership at the December and May Representative Assemblies along with the Central OEA/NEA District RA, which will be held in April.



Our NEA delegates will represent GJEA membership at the annual RA of the National Education Association. The NEA RA always takes place during the first week of July and will be held in Boston next summer.
